Volunteers will help patients in completing the forms required to enroll in free medication programs which will fill prescriptions for up to three months. Patients must have a prescription, a referral sheet, and a complete medical history form to qualify for free medication. A referral must be completed by a social worker or a social service agency. Faith pharmacy does not carry prenatal, birth control, or antibiotics medications.
