What is VINE®?

Victim Information and Notification Everyday

VINE is a free, anonymous, computer-based telephone program that provides victims of crime two important services: Information and Notification.

VINE Court Service Facts

- The offender will not know you are registered with VINE.
- If you are not available, VINE will leave a message on an answering machine. Court event notification calls will only be made between 9 a.m. and 8 p.m.
- In order to register to receive court notifications, you must have the complete case number, including trailer number if applicable.
- Court registrations are for felony cases only, with a CR case number, including trailer number if applicable.
- Do not leave a phone number with VINE that rings to a switchboard.
- You can leave more than one phone number with VINE.



What will VINE Court Service do for me?

You can call the VINE Court Service to hear information on a specific court case. You can also leave a phone number or e-mail address where you want to be notified when there is an upcoming court hearing, or a scheduling change in an upcoming court hearing.

*Please note that it is the responsibility of the registrant to keep up with his or her case number, including trailer number if applicable, and to keep the registration current. This service is available for felony cases only, with a CR case number, including trailer number if applicable.



What do I need to do?

1. Call 800-511-1670 toll-free from a touch tone phone and follow the instructions. You can also register online at www.vinelink.com for offender custody status changes or www.courts.ky.gov and click on "VINE COURT SERVICES" to register for a court case. (To register your e-mail address, either visit one of the Web sites mentioned above or press 0 to speak with an operator.)
2. When searching for a court case, you can register your phone number to receive updates on court hearings. Enter the phone number where you want to be reached, including area code, followed by the (#) key.
3. When VINE asks, make up a four-digit Personal Identification Number (PIN) that will be easy for you to remember. VINE will ask for the PIN when it calls you.
4. When VINE calls, listen to the message then enter your PIN when asked. Entering the PIN lets VINE know that you got the call, and will stop the service from calling you again.
