Brittany Piper Promoted to Assistant Supervisor in Probation and Parole District 13

FRANKFORT, Ky. (Nov. 13, 2018) – Kentucky Department of Corrections Division of Probation and Parole Director Johnathan Hall today announced the promotion of Brittany Piper to District 13 assistant supervisor. District 13 covers Crittenden, Daviess, Hancock, Henderson, McLean, Muhlenberg, Ohio, Union and Webster counties. Her promotion is effective Nov. 16.

"Brittany Piper has demonstrated that she has the willingness and dedication to help lead the Division of Probation and Parole in its mission," said Hall. "Her attention to detail, vast experience and ability to handle all duties assigned to her make her a valuable asset to District 13 and the division."

Piper began her career with the Division of Probation and Parole in November 2000 in the Paducah office as an office support assistant. She later transferred to the Morganfield office in 2003 in the same position. In October 2006, she was promoted to a probation and parole officer in that office. Piper has supervised caseloads and served as the class D officer for Crittenden, Webster, and Union counties, and has written presentence investigation reports for these three counties as well.

Piper has been a field training officer since the program's inception within the Division of Probation and Parole. An important part of her job has also been working with local jails in the area to ensure that inmates are released in a timely manner.

After having previously obtained an associate degree from Henderson Community College in management information systems in 1999, Piper later furthered her education by obtaining a bachelor's degree in independent studies with an emphasis in human services from Murray State University in 2006.
