Christopher Querey Promoted to Assistant Supervisor in Probation and Parole District 16

FRANKFORT, Ky. (Nov. 30, 2018) – Kentucky Department of Corrections Division of Probation and Parole Director Johnathan Hall today announced the promotion of Christopher Querey to assistant supervisor of District 16. District 16 supervises the northeast portion of Jefferson County. His promotion is effective Dec. 1.

"Christopher Querey has established himself as a truly knowledgeable and professional leader," said Hall. "He will undoubtedly become a pivotal part of the District 16 leadership team due to his experience, passion and commitment."

Querey began his career in 2014 as a probation and parole officer in District 16. In this position he supervised various caseloads, including both probation and parole, as well as interstate compact cases. In addition to his regular duties, he was a firearms instructor and a field training officer. He also served as the district's safety officer until his transfer to District 5 in early 2018. In District 5 Querey has prepared presentence investigation reports for Bullitt County, and grown very knowledgeable about jail custody credit calculations. He is familiar with many aspects of the job in both an urban and rural setting.

Prior to joining the DOC team, Querey served in the U.S. Army Reserve for over 20 years and retired in 2009 as a first sergeant. In this role he gained experience as a leader and received numerous awards and commendations, including the Meritorious Service Medal, Army Commendation Medal (8th award), Army Achievement Medal (7th award). Querey received the DOC Hero Award in 2017.
