David Trent Boggs Promoted to District 15 Assistant Supervisor

FRANKFORT, Ky. (April. 3, 2019) – Kentucky Department of Corrections Division of Probation and Parole Acting Director Erica Hargis announced today the promotion of David “Trent” Boggs to assistant supervisor of District 15. He will be primarily stationed in the Maysville office.

Boggs is a 14-year veteran of the department. District 15 includes Boyd, Carter, Greenup, Elliott, Morgan, Lawrence, Mason, Bracken, Lewis and Fleming counties.

“Trent Boggs is a proven professional with the experience and skills necessary to help lead the Division of Probation & Parole,” said Hargis. “His dedication and commitment to the agency has earned him this opportunity and we know he will continue to be a true asset to the department.”

Boggs began his career as a correctional officer at the newly built Little Sandy Correctional Complex in 2005. In October 2006, he was promoted to a probation and parole officer in District 15. Since that time, Boggs has worked in every capacity as an officer. For the past decade, he has supervised a specialized caseload of sex offenders in multiple counties within the district. He is also a field training officer and a facilitator for various reentry programs such as Moral Reconciliation Therapy (MRT), Portal, and Thinking for a Change.

Boggs currently facilitates the Community Supervision Orientation class at the Sandy Hook Probation and Parole office. For the past four years Boggs has volunteered to work overtime at the Luther Lockett Correctional Complex, providing much needed assistance during times of staffing shortages.

In 2002, Boggs received his bachelor’s degree from Morehead State University. He was the recipient of the District 15 KCCD Achievement Award in 2015.
