(May 16, 2019) – Kentucky Department of Corrections Division of Information Services Director Amanda Sayle today announced that Cedric Coleman has been promoted to systems engineer for the Information and Technology Branch. In this position, he will work closely with Kentucky Offender Management System (KOMS) staff in determining cost-effective uses of resources, database systems and storage. Additionally, he will collaborate with outside contractors and identify performance and technical issues. His position is effective today.

As one of the database administrators, his job included responding to diverse types of helpdesk computer-related issues.

Coleman is a member of the Southern States Correctional Association, Correctional Peace Officers Foundation, and Kentucky Council on Crime and Delinquency (KCCD). He previously served as president of the KCCD Capitol Chapter and as a member of the KCCD State Board of Directors.
