Jonathan Vincent Promoted to District 2 Assistant Supervisor

FRANKFORT, Ky. (Nov. 8, 2019) – Kentucky Department of Corrections Director of Probation and Parole Erica Hargis announced today the promotion of Jonathan Vincent to assistant supervisor in District 2. District 2 covers Allen, Butler, Christian, Edmonson, Hopkins, Logan, Simpson and Todd counties. Vincent's office will be located in Russellville.

"Jonathan Vincent is a veteran Department of Corrections employee and we are thrilled to add him to our leadership team, not only in District 2, but the division as a whole," said Hargis. "He has the knowledge, vision, and the dedication necessary to keep moving the mission forward within the Division of Probation and Parole."

Vincent began his career with the Department of Corrections as a probation and parole officer in 1995, supervising a regular caseload and writing presentence investigation reports in District 1. He was promoted to assistant supervisor in District 13 in 2009 and remained in that position for three years. Vincent transferred to the Reentry Branch as a classification and treatment officer for the home incarceration program in 2012, working there until the program was reorganized under Probation and Parole in 2014.

In December 2017, Vincent retired from the department while serving as a class D officer in District 2. He returned to Corrections as a probation and parole officer in March 2018. Most recently, he was assigned to a sex offender supervision caseload in District 2. He also serves as a Glock armorer and firearms instructor for the district.

Vincent is a 1995 graduate of Western Kentucky University. A 2009 graduate of the Department of Corrections Commissioner's Executive Leadership Program, Vincent has also been the recipient of Achievement Awards for District 1 in 2000 and District 13 in 2005.
