Tabatha Gray-Powell Promoted to Substance Abuse Program Administrator at LSCC

FRANKFORT, Ky. (July 17, 2020) – Department of Corrections Division of Addiction Services Director Sarah Johnson announced today that Tabatha Gray-Powell has been promoted to program administrator at Little Sandy Correctional Complex (LSCC) to lead the substance abuse program. Her position is effective July 1.

“We are excited to have Gray-Powell in this new leadership role,” said Johnson. “She already has a proven track record at LSCC SAP and her work experience, education and commitment to the program will serve her well in this new position.”

Gray-Powell began her career with state government in 2000 as an investigator with Child Protective Services, a position where she emphasized permanency outcomes for children and families. During her tenure there, she promoted to field office supervisor managing a team of six workers. In addition to her experience working in crisis intervention and as a court advocate, Gray-Powell gained skills in case management for populations with developmental disabilities and traumatic brain injuries.

Gray-Powell transferred to the Department of Corrections in 2016, working at LSCC as a social service clinician. She is currently working on becoming a certified alcohol and drug counselor (CADC).

A 1995 graduate of Morehead State University, Gray-Powell earned a bachelor’s degree in sociology with an emphasis in corrections and a minor in social work.
