### Adult Education

Level 1 – Literacy	
Course Description	This course is designed to help develop foundational knowledge and skills in reading, math, and written expression, and to prepare to earn a General Education Diploma (GED).
Course Length	Depending on student needs, students participate in this class for a varied length of time. Classes are scheduled Monday through Friday.
Educational Good Time (EGT)	Individual levels are not eligible for good time credit.
Admission Criteria	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>All offenders without a GED® or a high school diploma are eligible to participate.</li> <li>Participants with a TABE 11/12 score of 441 or below in Reading or a score of 448 or below in Math would be assigned to this class.</li> </ul>
Course Content	Course content focuses on developing foundational knowledge and skills in reading, math, and written expression, and to prepare offenders to get a GED® diploma. Instructional materials may include Laubach, Steck-Vaughn, Paxen, PACE, and Kentucky Educational Television (KET), as well as audio-visual materials and computer courses.

Level 2 – Adult Basic Education (ABE)	
Course Description	This course is designed to develop knowledge and skills in reading, math, and written expression, and to prepare to earn a General Education Diploma (GED).
Course Length	Depending on student needs, students participate in class for a varied length of time. Classes are scheduled Monday through Friday.
Educational Good Time (EGT)	Individual levels are not eligible for good time credit.
Admission Criteria	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>All offenders without a GED® or a high school diploma are eligible to participate.</li> <li>Participants with a TABE 11/12 score between 442 and 500 in Reading or a score between 449 and 495 in Math would be assigned to this class.</li> </ul>
Course Content	Course content provides a continuation of Level I. Greater stress is on middle and upper levels of study. Other methodologies may include (but are not limited to) computer-assisted instruction in reading, mathematics, and language.

Level 3 – General Education Diploma (GED)	
Course Description	This course is designed to develop higher knowledge and skills in reading, math, and written expression, and to prepare to earn a General Education Diploma (GED).
Course Length	Depending on student needs, students participate in class for a varied length of time. Classes are scheduled Monday through Friday.
Educational Good Time (EGT)	Individual levels are not eligible for good time credit.
Admission Criteria	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• All offenders without a GED® or a high school diploma are eligible to participate.</li> <li>• Participants with a TABE 11/12 score of 501 or higher in Reading or a score of 496 or higher in Math would be assigned to this class.</li> </ul>
Course Content	Course content provides a continuation of Level 2. Study materials from Contemporary, McGraw-Hill, Cambridge, Steck-Vaughn, Paxen, and other educational publishers may be provided. Computer courses provide extra drills for those offenders who require them, and videotapes by KET may be available for additional reinforcement.

Course Description	College/university level classes are designed to develop higher knowledge and skills in a variety of areas and subjects to prepare to earn a diploma or degree.
Course Length	Depending on the college/university, field of study and emphasis areas, students participate in postsecondary classes for a varied length of time.
Educational Good Time (EGT)	90 days awarded for: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Associate’s degree</li> <li>• Bachelor’s degree</li> <li>• Master’s degree</li> <li>• Doctoral degree</li> </ul>
Admission Criteria	All offenders with a GED® or a high school diploma are eligible to apply.
Course Content	Course content will vary depending on the field of study.

Additional Information	The student is responsible for paying all tuition and fees that are not covered by financial aid. Upon successful completion of a postsecondary degree, the student must give the official transcript to their Probation & Parole Officer to be submitted to Central Office at <a href="mailto:DOCEdu.Registrar@ky.gov">DOCEdu.Registrar@ky.gov</a> for an EGT award of <b>90</b> days.

# Career and Technical Education

CT Fundamentals	
Course Description	This course is designed to meet the needs of the beginning offender in the Career and Technical fields or as a refresher to the experienced craftsman. CT-Fundamentals may be taken as a stand-alone course or concurrently with a trade enrollment; however, it is a mandatory component and prerequisite for the completion of all NCCER and NOCTI Career and Technical Education courses.
Course Length	A minimum of six (6) hours of class time per week for a minimum of six (6) calendar months.

- All performance exercises must be completed as “Satisfactory” in accordance with NCCER standards.

The program will give the student a complete understanding of Rules and Regulations of the Department of Transportation and other federal and state regulatory agencies

<b>Materials Management</b>	
<b>Course Description</b>	This course will provide guidance and instruction to recycling managers, supervisors and coordinators in the area of waste reduction through recycling. The course is designed to introduce the tools and principles of Lean Manufacturing focusing on team development, working together as a team, how to improve processes, and to eliminate waste and keep it from coming back. Participants will earn certifications in OSHA 10 General Industry, Lift Trucks Safety, Bobcat Skid-Steer Loading, Shipping/Receiving and Inventory Control. All instruction is conducted in an ongoing, working manufacturing environment
