INTRODUCTION

Supporting a successful transition to the community and maintaining stability within the offender population is central to the mission of the Kentucky Department of Corrections. The Department protects public safety by ensuring that offenders receive programming to support their successful return to the community. Programs are standardized across the Department, implemented with dedicated resources, and regularly reviewed for quality assurance.

This practical guide was prepared to highlight the Department's programs. Each program summary in this directory contains key information: a Program Description, Time Frame, Admission Criteria, Program Content, Applicable Policies and locations.

The Department maintains a catalogue of evidence-based, life skills, promising practice, and substance abuse programs to address a wide range of reentry, supervision, and incarceration needs. Program offerings vary based on available resources and the needs of the offender population. The Department of Corrections maintains a list of the programs that are currently available.

General Information

Definitions:

<u>Evidence Based</u> Programs are programs demonstrated by scientific research to reliably produce reductions in recidivism.

<u>Promising Practice</u> represents a program that may have some research or data showing positive outcomes but does not meet criteria as an Evidence Based program. Promising practices have a clear focus and includes processes of accountability and evaluation.

<u>Life Skills</u> Programs provide strategies to assist in removing barriers for successful reintegration and address skill areas including time management, money management, use of technology, communication, and social skills.

<u>Substance Abuse</u> Programs are evidence based drug treatment programs for individuals with a substance use disorder.

Program Description	This Evidence Based program combines group presentations and individual assignments, along with facilitator guidance when necessary. The program was designed in a criminal justice setting for offenders involved in the criminal justice system. MRT [©] targets an offender's belief system and attempts to raise their level of moral reasoning in their decision-making process. The MRT [©] program has been researched for over thirty years and has proven reduction in recidivism levels at multiple points of progress within the program, as well as after overall program completion. MRT [©] is designed to achieve formal program completion after 12 in-group steps. The workbook for this program is entitled 'How to Escape Your Prison' [©] and includes the use of a separate facilitator guide. *MRT certification is required to facilitate this program.	
Time Frame	Length of time in program is dependent on individual offender progress, although offenders can generally expect to participate in 24-36 open-ended group sessions. Offenders will also be required to work individually on homework assignments as part of the program requirements.	
Program Credit	This program receives 90 days program credit upon completion.

Program Description	The MRT [©] Mentoring program strives to ensure a higher success rate for those who have previously completed MRT [©] . A Mentor within the MRT [©] program will be held to a higher behavioral expectation than those participating in the MRT [©] group. Mentorship is beneficial for both the offender serving as the mentor, as well as for the offenders participating in the MRT [©] program. As a mentor, this offender will be expected to revisit steps 1-4 from the offender's original 'How to Escape your Prison' [©] workbook, along with completion of the 'Character Development' © Workbook.
	*MRT certification is required to facilitate this program.
Time Frame	Length of time in program is dependent on individual offender progress, although offenders can generally expect to participate in 24-36 open-ended group sessions. Offenders will also be required to work individually on homework assignments as part of the program requirements.
Program Credit	This program receives 90 days program credit upon completion.

Program Description	This Cognitive Behavioral program was developed to confront Anti-Social and Criminal Thinking errors. Completion entails 10 modules with a minimum of 10-12 group sessions utilizing the 'Thinking for Good' Workbook, and the completion of homework assignments prepared outside of group. *MRT certification is required to facilitate this program.
Time Frame	Depending on offender needs and progression, the offender should expect to participate in a minimum of 10 – 12 group sessions.
Program Credit	This program receives 60 days program credit upon completion.
Admission Criteria	All program recommendations are based on their specific criminogenic needs identified in the KYRAS assessment.

Time Frame	*MRT certification is required to facilitate this program. Depending on offender needs and progression, this program includes completion of 12 modules with a minimum of 12 sessions utilizing the 'Parenting and Family Values' workbook.
Program Credit	This program receives 90 days program credit upon completion.
Admission Criteria	Prerequisite: Offenders should be in an active parenting role. All program recommendations are based on their specific criminogenic needs, as identified in the KYRAS assessment.

Program Description	This Cognitive-Behavioral program is designed to assist offenders in recognizing and overcoming anger. This program includes completion of 8 modules with a minimum of 8-10 group sessions utilizing the 'Coping with Anger'® workbook, various supplemental materials, and the completion of homework assignments prepared outside of group. *MRT certification is required to facilitate this program.
Time Frame	Depending on offender needs and progression, offenders can expect to participate in a minimum of 10 – 12 group sessions.
Program Credit	This program receives 90 days program credit upon completion.
Admission Criteria	All program recommendations are based on their specific criminogenic needs identified in the KYRAS assessment.

Program Description	This Cognitive-Behavioral program is designed to assist with relapse prevention by helping offenders to recognize risky situations, cravings, and triggers. This program requires completion of eight (8) modules over a minimum of 8-10 group sessions. Groups are openended and require the completion of the 'Staying Quit'® workbook, as well as preparation of homework assignments outside of group.
	*MRT certification is required to facilitate this program.
Time Frame	Depending on offender needs and progression, the offender should expect to participate in a minimum of 8-10 sessions.
Program Credit	This program receives 60 days program credit upon completion.
Admission Criteria	Prerequisite: Must have successfully completed the SAP program prior to admission. All program recommendations are based on their specific criminogenic needs identified in the KYRAS assessment and having a substance use history.

Program Description	This Cognitive-Behavioral program focuses on providing treatment to offenders involved in addictive/co-dependent relationships — confronting the issues of manipulation and dependence. Targets domestic violence, unhealthy relationships, enabling, substance abusers and criminality. Offenders will be required to participate in a minimum of 12 group sessions, along with preparation of homework assignments outside of group. This program utilizes the 'Untangling Relationships' workbook. *MRT certification is required to facilitate this program.
Time Frame	Depending on offender needs and progression, this program includes completion of 12 modules with a minimum of 12 group sessions utilizing the 'Untangling Relationships' workbook.
Program Credit	This program receives 90 days program credit upon completion.
Admission Criteria	All program recommendations are based on their specific criminogenic needs identified in the KYRAS assessment.

Some barriers addressed in this program are housing, employment, transportation, money management, parenting, etc. *PORTAL New Direction certification is required to facilitate this program.		
Time Frame	Depending on offender needs and progression, this program is a 20 hour, 16-module program.		
Program Credit	This program receives 60 days program credit upon completion.		
Admission Criteria	All program recommendations are based on their specific criminogenic needs identified in the KYRAS assessment and should be 36 months prior to release from incarceration.

Program Name	Sex Offender Treatment Program - Community
Program Description	This Evidence Based program consists of individual and group counseling for offenders in the community. This program is geared to provide tools that sexual offenders can use for controlling their sexually assaultive behavior. Sexual Offenders are referred and are screened for acceptance into the program that typically takes months to complete. The program provides treatment for sex offenders to allow them to manage their deviant behavior and thoughts.
Time Frame	Depending on offender needs and progression, this treatment program may take from 18 months to 24 months to complete.
Program Credit	This program is eligible for 90 days program credit upon completion, however, application of sentence credits are subject to statute governing eligibility of sentence credit for sex offenders.
Admission Criteria	This treatment program is statutorily required based on the offender's crime and conviction date.

Program Name	Sex Offender Treatment Program - Private Providers
Program Description	This Evidence Based program consists of individual and group counseling by private providers to offenders in the community. This program is geared to provide tools that sexual offenders can use for controlling their sexually assaultive behavior. Sexual Offenders are referred and are screened for acceptance into the program. 501 KAR 6:220 defines the amount of time it takes to complete SOTP-P. The program provides treatment for sex offenders to allow them to manage their deviant behavior and thoughts.
Time Frame	Depending on offender risk level, previous treatment, and needs assessment needs and progression, this treatment program may take from 18 months to 24 months to complete.
Program Credit	This program is eligible for 90 days program credit upon completion, however, application of sentence credits are subject to statute governing eligibility of sentence credit for sex offenders.
Admission Criteria	This treatment program is statutorily required based on the offender's crime and conviction date.

Locations	Private providers approved by the Sex Offender Risk Assessment Advisory Board provide sex offender treatment in different locations throughout Kentucky.

Program Description	This Evidence Based journaling program combines group presentations and individual assignments, along with facilitator guidance when necessary. The MEE Journal Series (Motivational, Educational and Experiential Series) provides a structured, client centered, addiction series. MEE combines Cognitive Behavioral Therapy (CBT), Motivational Interviewing (MI), Trans theoretical Model of Change, experiential writing, and action-oriented steps, facilitated in groups of 10 – 12 within a group format, to motivate residents toward change.
Time Frame	Length of time in program is dependent on individual offender progress, although offenders can generally expect to participate in 48-72 hours of group sessions. Offenders will also be required to work individually on homework assignments as part of the program requirements.
Program Credit	This program receives 90 days program credit upon completion.
Admission Criteria	All program recommendations are based on their specific criminogenic needs identified in the KyRAS assessment.

Program Name	Recovery Kentucky Center (RKC) and Reentry Service Center (RSC) Community Long-term Residential SAP
Program Description	Recovery Kentucky Centers (RKCs): Through a joint effort by the Kentucky Department of Corrections, Kentucky Housing Corporation, and the Department for Local Government (DLG), Recovery Kentucky was created to assist Kentuckians recovering from substance use disorders and to reduce homelessness. There are 14 Recovery Kentucky Centers across the Commonwealth. Each Center offers a total of 100 treatment/recovery beds, with 60 beds contracted by the Kentucky Department of Corrections in each location. As supportive housing projects, each center uses a recovery program model that includes peer support, daily living skills classes, job responsibilities, and establishes new behaviors. This type of supportive housing and recovery program is proven to help people who face the most complex challenges to live more stable, productive lives.
	Reentry Service Centers (RSCs): Those individuals in need of Substance Use Disorder treatment, who meet the classification criteria for community custody, may participate in programs available in reentry service centers approved by the department to offer Substance Use Disorder treatment programming.
Time Frame	Recovery Kentucky Centers (RKCs): The program can range from 6 to 18 months, however, DOC only requires completion through Phase I and the offender can choose to stay longer if he/she chooses. The Recovery Kentucky model is broken into 5 Phases: Safe off the Streets (SoS), Motivational Track I (MTI), Motivational Track II (MTII), Phase I, and Phase II (see section on RKC/RSC mentor). DOC only requires SoS, MTI, MTII, and Phase I. Reentry Service Centers (RSCs): The program shall be six (6) months in duration. Most RSCs follow a Therapeutic Community model of treatment, which means it is a participative, group-based approach to long term drug addiction. The community itself, through self-help and mutual support, is the principal means for promoting personal change.
Program Credit	This program receives 90 days program credit upon completion.
Admission Criteria	Applicant has evidence of a substance use disorder that requires treatment. Applicant shall be deemed appropriate for this level of care by clinical staff within the Division of Addiction Services. Must be medically and psychologically stable – applicable to RKC placement only. From incarcerated population: If an individual receives a recommendation of parole upon completion (PUC) of SAP, they shall be assessed by a Branch Manager or Program Administrator within the Division of Addiction Services to determine the appropriate level of care. If it is determined that the individual is appropriate for community/RKC/RSC they shall be released to treatment in the community.

Applicable Policies	From community population: The court or supervising probation/parole officer can refer a client to the community Social Service Clinicians (SSC) to determine the appropriate level of care. Applicant shall have a custody status of Level 1 (community) – applicable to RSC placement only. 	SHARE-CO is a facility for men with co-occurring Substance Use Disorders and Serious Mental Illness. The program addresses the substance use component by utilizing the peer-driven therapeutic community model that the Hope Center Men's and Women's Recovery Program has utilized for many years in its partnership with the Kentucky Department of Corrections. SHARE-CO utilizes Recovery Dynamics curriculum, integrating the twelve-step model with the peer-driven therapeutic community model.
Program Description	Due to comorbid psychiatric conditions, individuals in the co-occurring program require certain accommodations to ensure success. This includes supplementing the peer-driven therapeutic community model with licensed mental health professionals to provide direct services and support. The program also maintains smaller therapeutic community groups, providing a less intimidating and more personal format, which allows both staff and offenders to focus on the particular needs of this group. SHARE-CO is partnered with New Vista, a local community mental health provider, to provide onsite mental health counseling as well as referrals for outpatient psychiatric counseling as needed. Other accommodations include specialized mental health groups that are specific to integrating mental health with the twelve-step model based Recovery Dynamics curriculum, while still affording offenders the opportunity to integrate into classes with the Hope Center Men's Recovery Program to provide them with the full scope of the Hope Center's services.

The program provides onsite mental health counseling through a partnership with New Vista, a local community health provider, and have licensed mental health professionals to offer support services, crisis intervention, and assist with other immediate needs. Program Description	The Reentry Drug Supervision Program (RDS) is a pilot program resulting from Senate Bill 120. The program seeks to restore lives and reduce recidivism rates of inmates and parolees suffering from substance use disorder. The program consists of two phases lasting a minimum of twelve months or until sentence is completed. Phase one (1) participants will attend group therapy, reentry program team meetings, submit to random drug screens, obtain and maintain full time employment, training, or education, ensure payment of court obligations and supervision fees, indicate an appropriate understanding of recovery principles, attend self-help programs and obtain and maintain housing approved by the re-entry team. Phase two (2) participants will attend weekly meetings with the re-entry team and continue to submit to random drug screens.
Time Frame	The program is twelve (12) months in length.
Program Credit	This program receives 90 days program credit upon completion.
Admission Criteria	Participants meeting eligibility requirements will be given an application and those who submit an application are then reviewed by Addiction Services for program recommendation.
