#### INTRODUCTION

Supporting a successful transition to the community and maintaining stability within the offender population is central to the mission of the Kentucky Department of Corrections. The Department protects public safety by ensuring that offenders receive programming to support their successful return to the community. Programs are standardized across the Department, implemented with dedicated resources, and regularly reviewed for quality assurance.

This practical guide was prepared to highlight the Department's programs. Each program summary in this directory contains key information: a Program Description, Time Frame, Admission Criteria, Program Content, Applicable Policies and locations.

The Department maintains a catalogue of evidence-based, life skills, promising practice, and substance abuse programs to address a wide range of reentry, supervision, and incarceration needs. Program offerings vary based on available resources and the needs of the offender population. The Department of Corrections maintains a list of the programs that are currently available.

#### **General Information**

#### **Definitions:**

<u>Evidence Based</u> Programs are programs demonstrated by scientific research to reliably produce reductions in recidivism.

<u>Promising Practice</u> represents a program that may have some research or data showing positive outcomes but does not meet criteria as an Evidence Based program. Promising practices have a clear focus and includes processes of accountability and evaluation.

<u>Life Skills</u> Programs provide strategies to assist in removing barriers for successful reintegration and address skill areas including time management, money management, use of technology, communication, and social skills.

<u>Substance Abuse</u> Programs are evidence based drug treatment programs for individuals with a substance use disorder.

Program Description	This <b>Evidence Based</b> program combines group presentations and individual assignments, along with facilitator guidance when necessary. The program was designed in a criminal justice setting for offenders involved in the criminal justice system. MRT <sup>©</sup> targets an offender's belief system and attempts to raise their level of moral reasoning in their decision-making process. The MRT <sup>©</sup> program has been researched for over thirty years and has proven reduction in recidivism levels at multiple points of progress within the program, as well as after overall program completion. MRT <sup>©</sup> is designed to achieve formal program completion after 12 in-group steps. The workbook for this program is entitled 'How to Escape Your Prison' <sup>©</sup> and includes the use of a separate facilitator guide.
Time Frame	Length of time in program is dependent on individual offender progress, although offenders can generally expect to participate in 24-36 open-ended group sessions. Offenders will also be required to work individually on homework assignments as part of the program requirements.
Program Credit	This program receives <b>90</b> days program credit upon completion.

Program Description	The MRT <sup>©</sup> Mentoring program strives to ensure a higher success rate for those who have previously completed MRT <sup>©</sup> . A Mentor within the MRT <sup>©</sup> program will be held to a higher behavioral expectation than those participating in the MRT <sup>©</sup> group. Mentorship is beneficial for both the offender serving as the mentor, as well as for the offenders participating in the MRT <sup>©</sup> program. As a mentor, this offender will be expected to revisit steps 1-4 from the offender's original 'How to Escape your Prison' <sup>©</sup> workbook, along with completion of the 'Character Development' <sup>©</sup> Workbook.
Time Frame	Length of time in program is dependent on individual offender progress, although offenders can generally expect to participate in 24-36 open-ended group sessions. Offenders will also be required to work individually on homework assignments as part of the program requirements.

Offenders will be required to participate in a minimum of 12 group sessions, along with preparation of homework assignments outside of group. Some barriers addressed in this program are housing, employment, transportation, money management, parenting, etc. *PORTAL New Direction certification is required to facilitate this program.	
Time Frame	Completion of this program is a minimum of 21 hours of group participation, and preparation and presentation of a Reentry/Maintenance plan in front of the group. PORTAL New Direction consists of 16-modules, facilitated no more than twice per week.

Program Name	Sex Offender Treatment Program - Community
Program Description	This <b>Evidence Based program</b> consists of individual and group counseling for offenders in the community. This program is geared to provide tools that sexual offenders can use for controlling their sexually assaultive behavior. Sexual Offenders are referred and are screened for acceptance into the program that typically takes months to complete. The program provides treatment for sex offenders to allow them to manage their deviant behavior and thoughts.
Time Frame	Depending on offender needs and progression, this treatment program may take from 24 months to 30 months to complete.
Program Credit	This program is eligible for <b>90</b> days program credit upon completion, however, application of sentence credits are subject to statute governing eligibility of sentence credit for sex offenders.
Admission Criteria	This treatment program is statutorily required based on the offender's crime and conviction date.

Program Name	Sex Offender Treatment Program - Private Providers	
Program Description	This <b>Evidence Based program</b> consists of individual and group counseling by private providers to offenders in the community. This program is geared to provide tools that sexual offenders can use for controlling their sexually assaultive behavior. Sexual Offenders are referred and are screened for acceptance into the program. 501 KAR 6:220 defines the amount of time it takes to complete SOTP-P. The program provides treatment for sex offenders to allow them to manage their deviant behavior and thoughts.	
Time Frame	Depending on offender risk level, previous treatment, and needs assessment needs and progression, this treatment program may take from 18 months to 24 months to complete.	
Program Credit	This program is eligible for <b>90</b> days program credit upon completion, however, application of sentence credits are subject to statute governing eligibility of sentence credit for sex offenders.

Program Description	This <b>Evidence Based</b> journaling program combines group presentations and individual assignments, along with facilitator guidance when necessary. The MEE Journal Series (Motivational, Educational and Experiential Series) provides a structured, client centered addiction series. MEE combines Cognitive Behavioral Therapy (CBT), Motivational Interviewing (MI), Trans theoretical Model of Change, experiential writing, and action oriented steps, facilitated in groups of $10 - 12$ within a group format, to motivate resident toward change.	
Time Frame	Length of time in program is dependent on individual offender progress, although offenders can generally expect to participate in 48-72 hours of group sessions. Offenders will also be required to work individually on homework assignments as part of the program requirements.

Program Description	<b>Recovery Kentucky Centers (RKCs):</b> Through a joint effort by the Kentucky Department of Corrections, Kentucky Housing Corporation, and the Department for Local Government (DLG), Recovery Kentucky was created to assist Kentuckians recovering from substance use disorders and to reduce homelessness. There are 14 Recovery Kentucky Centers across the Commonwealth. Each Center offers a total of 100 treatment/recovery beds, with 60 beds contracted by the Kentucky Department of Corrections in each location. 	<b>Reentry Service Centers (RSCs):</b> Those individuals in need of Substance Use Disorder treatment, who meet the classification criteria for community custody, may participate in programs available in reentry service centers approved by the department to offer Substance Use Disorder treatment programming.		
Time Frame	Recovery Kentucky Centers (RKCs): The program can range from 6 to 18 months, however, DOC only requires completion through Phase I and the offender can choose to stay longer if he/she chooses. The Recovery Kentucky model is broken into 5 Phases: Safe off the Streets (SoS), Motivational Track I (MTI), Motivational Track II (MTII), Phase I, and Phase II (see section on RKC/RSC mentor). DOC only requires SoS, MTI, MTII, and Phase I. Reentry Service Centers (RSCs): The program shall be six (6) months in duration. Most RSCs follow a Therapeutic Community model of treatment, which means it is a participative, group- based approach to long term drug addiction. The community itself, through self-help and mutual support, is the principal means for promoting personal change.

Program Name	SAP - VOA HWB
Program Description	The Volunteers of America Men's Halfway Back Program is offered to justice involved males who are on either probation or parole. The program was specifically designed to deliver the customary six-month curriculum at an accelerated pace using a modified schedule. This modification allows participants an opportunity to complete treatment in less time than traditional residential programs based on a client's individualized clinical progress as determined by the treatment team. A Treatment Team is held weekly in partnership with VOA and DOC Division of Addiction Services staff to review each client's clinical progress as it is correlated to successful program completion.
Time Frame	This is a short-term residential treatment program. Length of stay is based on level of care criteria in conjunction with treatment team review.
Program Credit	The VOA program is approved for the issuance of 45 days program good time credit when clients successfully compete the program in 45, 60, or 90 days. If it is determined by the treatment team that a client needs an additional 90 days of care (beyond the initial 90 days) resulting in the client achieving a full 180 days of treatment, then at the successful completion of those 180 days the client will be issued two (2) certificates that will each be valid for 45 days PGTC for a total of 90 days of PGTC.
Admission Criteria	Those individuals in need of treatment for Substance Use Disorder who meet the clinical and classification criteria for community custody at this level of care may participate in this program. Must meet general criteria for referral to Reentry Service Centers approved by the Department to offer Substance Use Disorder treatment programming. Referrals can be made for parolees, probationers, ISC or HIP (limited). VOA HWB Program is not equipped to handle severe mental health issues. Cases may be reviewed on an individual basis. The program is not designed to manage clients with severe, chronic medical conditions that require frequent doctors' appointments and/or treatments that would call for them to be absent from the facility. This location is unable to serve sex offenders due to women and children being housed on the same campus. Referrals are made through the Community SSC and a specification should be made on the referral form to the Placement Office requesting "VOA HWB Only."

Community SAP - Intensive Outpatient Program
Through an agreement with the Regional Community Mental Health Centers (CMHC), individuals who meet the clinical and classification criteria may attend a less restrictive Intensive Outpatient Program (IOP) which generally takes six months to complete. Offenders meet weekly in an outpatient setting to receive <b>evidenced based</b> substance use disorder curriculum. Offenders must abide by all treatment program standards and submit to random drug screening. Due to an enhanced need in central Kentucky, the department contracts with the Hope Center to provide IOP Substance Use Disorder treatment services akin to those offered in the CMHC's. Eligible candidates include MRS, probationers, parolees, HIP, and pre-trial diversions.
This is a program which generally takes six-months to complete broken into three phases, totaling 56 treatment sessions. Each session is two hours in length. PHASE 1: 3 sessions each week for three months (36 sessions total) PHASE 2: 2 sessions each week for two months (16 sessions total) PHASE 3: 1 session each week for one month (4 sessions total) PHASE 3: 1 session each week for one month (4 sessions total) Offenders in the program may be restarted once, to the beginning of the phase they are in, but the total amount of time in the program cannot exceed 92 sessions.
This program resolves <b>00</b> days program credit upon completion
This program receives <b>90</b> days program credit upon completion.
Offenders may be referred to IOP who present with a substance use disorder, which is causing multidimensional instability. IOP can be an entry point into treatment, a step down level of care, or a step up level of care. IOP would be considered for offenders who would likely benefit from structure and accountability. Offenders must be medically and mentally stable to attend two-hour treatment sessions in a group setting. From incarceration population: If an individual receives a recommendation of parole upon completion (PUC) of SAP, they shall
be assessed by a Branch Manager or Program Administrator within the Division of Addiction Services to determine the appropriate level of care. If it is determined that the individual is appropriate for SAP-IOP and has a verified home placement, and can meet the requirements of attendance, they shall be released to IOP treatment in the community. Individuals who are enrolled in SAP at the time of their release from a jail or institution can enter IOP with credit for the weeks of treatment already completed, thus they can graduate without completing the full 56 IOP sessions.
From community population: The court or supervising probation/parole officer can refer an offender to the community Social Service Clinicians (SSC) to determine the appropriate level of care. ICOTS and Misdemeanor upon approval.

Program Name	Community SAMAT (Supportive Assistance with Medication for Addiction Treatment)
Program Description	SAMAT is focused on preventing overdose, relapse, and recidivism for individuals with Opioid Use Disorder and/or Alcohol Use Disorder whom have completed or are currently engaged in a Substance Abuse Program (SAP) through the implementation of FDA-approved medication for addiction treatment, which includes Vivitrol (naltrexone). The program seeks to restore lives and reduce recidivism rates of inmates and parolees suffering from substance use disorder. The program consists of two phases lasting a minimum of twelve months or until sentence is completed. Phase one (1) participants will attend group therapy, reentry program team meetings, submit to random drug screens, obtain and maintain full time employment, training, or education, ensure payment of court obligations and supervision fees, indicate an appropriate understanding of recovery principles, attend self-help programs and obtain and maintain housing approved by the re-entry team. Phase two (2) participants will attend weekly meetings with the re-entry team and continue to submit to random drug screens.
