INTRODUCTION

Supporting a successful transition to the community and maintaining stability within the offender population is central to the mission of the Kentucky Department of Corrections. The Department protects public safety by ensuring that offenders receive programming to support their successful return to the community. Programs are standardized across the Department, implemented with dedicated resources, and regularly reviewed for quality assurance.

This practical guide was prepared to highlight the Department's programs. Each program summary in this directory contains key information: a Program Description, Time Frame, Admission Criteria, Program Content, Applicable Policies, and Locations.

The Department maintains a catalogue of evidence-based, life skills, promising practice, and substance abuse programs to address a wide range of reentry, supervision, and incarceration needs. Program offerings vary based on available resources and the needs of the offender population. The Department of Corrections maintains a list of the programs that are currently available.

General Information

Definitions:

<u>Evidence Based</u> Programs are programs demonstrated by scientific research to reliably produce reductions in recidivism.

<u>Promising Practice</u> represents a program that may have some research or data showing positive outcomes but does not meet criteria as an Evidence Based program. Promising practices have a clear focus and includes processes of accountability and evaluation.

<u>Life Skills</u> Programs provide strategies to assist in removing barriers for successful reintegration and address skill areas including time management, money management, use of technology, communication, and social skills.

<u>Substance Abuse</u> Programs are evidence based drug treatment programs for individuals with a substance use disorder.

<u>Religious Program</u> means a program that does not have a secular purpose or a program, which has a curriculum that advances or inhibits specific religion(s) and does not qualify for program credit.

Program Name	MRT [©] – Moral Reconation Therapy MRT [©] is the product of Correctional Counseling Inc. (CCI). MRT [©] and its related products are property of CCI. CCI is the sole source provider of MRT [©] products.
Program Description	This Evidence Based program combines group presentations and individual assignments, along with facilitator guidance when necessary. The program was designed in a criminal justice setting for offenders involved in the criminal justice system. MRT [©] targets an offender's belief system and attempts to raise their level of moral reasoning in their decision-making process. The MRT [©] program has been researched for over thirty years and has proven reduction in recidivism levels at multiple points of progress within the program, as well as after overall program completion. MRT [©] is designed to achieve formal program completion after 12 in-group steps. The workbook for this program is entitled 'How to Escape Your Prison' [©] and includes the use of a separate facilitator guide. *MRT certification is required to facilitate this program.
Time Frame	Length of time in program is dependent on individual offender progress, although offenders can generally expect to participate in 24-36 open-ended group sessions. Offenders will also be required to work individually on homework assignments as part of the program requirements.
Program Credit	This program receives 90 days program credit upon completion.
Admission Criteria	All program recommendations are based on their specific criminogenic needs identified in the KyRAS assessment.

Program Name	MRT [©] Mentor MRT [©] is the product of Correctional Counseling Inc. (CCI). MRT [©] and its related products are property of CCI. CCI is the sole source provider of MRT [©] products.
Program Description	The MRT [©] Mentoring program strives to ensure a higher success rate for those who have previously completed MRT [©] . A Mentor within the MRT [©] program will be held to a higher behavioral expectation than those participating in the MRT [©] group. Mentorship is beneficial for both the offender serving as the mentor, as well as for the offenders participating in the MRT [©] program. As a mentor, this offender will be expected to revisit steps 1-4 from the offender's original 'How to Escape your Prison' [©] workbook, along with completion of the 'Character Development' [©] Workbook. A maximum of 3 mentors per MRT group of 15 (ratio of 1:5) shall assist in monitoring and assisting the current involved group with step completion while working through their own specific program curriculum. *MRT certification is required to facilitate this program.
Time Frame	Length of time in program is dependent on individual offender progress, although offenders can generally expect to participate in 24-36 open-ended group sessions. Offenders will also be required to work individually on homework assignments as part of the program requirements.
Program Credit	This program receives 90 days program credit upon completion.
Admission Criteria	Prerequisite: completion of MRT. All program recommendations are based on their specific criminogenic needs identified in the KYRAS assessment.

	Reentry Service Centers (RSCs): Some of the RSCs utilize a RKC model which is referenced above. However, most of the RSCs utilize the Therapeutic Community Model to treat clients with substance use disorder. The TC model is a peer driven program incorporating Cognitive Behavioral Therapy in conjunction with evidence-based curriculum. Participants engage in education regarding their substance use disorder and have the opportunity to learn, practice, and apply pro-social behaviors. The community itself, through self-help and mutual support, is the principal means for promoting personal change.

Program Description	The Volunteers of America Men's Halfway Back Program is offered to justice involved males who are on either probation or parole. The program was specifically designed to deliver the customary six-month curriculum at an accelerated pace using a modified schedule. This modification allows participants an opportunity to complete treatment in less time than traditional residential programs based on a client's individualized clinical progress as determined by the treatment team. A Treatment Team is held weekly in partnership with VOA and DOC Division of Addiction Services staff to review each client's clinical progress as it is correlated to successful program completion.
Time Frame	This is a short-term residential treatment program. Length of stay is based on level of care criteria in conjunction with treatment team review.
Program Credit	The VOA program is approved for the issuance of 45 days program good time credit when clients successfully compete the program in an average length of 45, 60, or 90 days. If it is determined by the treatment team that a client needs an additional 90 days of care (beyond the initial 90 days) resulting in the client achieving a full 180 days of treatment, then at the successful completion of those 180 days the client will be issued two (2) certificates that will each be valid for 45 days PGTC for a total of 90 days of PGTC.
Admission Criteria	Those individuals in need of treatment for Substance Use Disorder who meet the clinical and classification criteria for community custody at this level of care may participate in this program. Must meet general criteria for referral to Reentry Service Centers approved by the Department to offer Substance Use Disorder treatment programming. Referrals can be made for parolees, probationers, ISC or HIP (limited). VOA HWB Program is not equipped to handle severe mental health issues. Cases may be reviewed on an individual basis. The program is not designed to manage clients with severe, chronic medical conditions that require frequent doctors' appointments and/or treatments that would call for them to be absent from the facility. This location is unable to serve sex offenders due to women and children being housed on the same campus. Referrals are made through the Community SSC and a specification should be made on the referral form to the Placement Office requesting "VOA HWB Only."

Program Description	Comprehensive Outpatient substance use disorder treatment program can be an initial entry point into treatment or accessed as a continuum of care for offenders determined to be in need of substance use disorder services. Participants receive weekly group treatment in an outpatient setting through an agreement with the Regional Community Mental Health Centers (CMHC). Participants receive evidenced based substance use disorder curriculum and must abide by all treatment program standards including submitting to random drug screening. Due to an enhanced need in central Kentucky, the department contracts with the Hope Center to provide Substance Use Disorder treatment services akin to those offered in the CMHC's. Eligible candidates include MRS, probationers, parolees, HIP, and pre-trial diversions. ICOTS
	and Misdemeanor offenders upon approval. This program is broken into three phases, moving from most intensive to least intensive.
Time Frame	CMHC's provide two-hour sessions, at the following schedule: PHASE 1: 3 sessions per week for 12 weeks (36 sessions/72 hours) PHASE 2: 2 sessions per week for 8 weeks (16 sessions/32 hours) PHASE 3: 1 session per week for 4 weeks (4 sessions) Thus, CMHC participants generally complete in six months (56 sessions/112 hours) Hope Center provides three-hour session, at the following schedule: PHASE 1: 3 sessions per week for 8 weeks (24 sessions/72 hours) PHASE 2: 2 sessions per week for 5 weeks (10 sessions/30 hours) PHASE 3: 1 session per week for 3 weeks (3 sessions/9 hours) Thus, Hope Center participants generally complete in four months (37 sessions/111 hours) Participants in the program may be restarted once, to the beginning of the phase they are in if a clinical need arises.
Program	This program receives 90 days program credit upon completion.
Admission Criteria	Offenders may be referred to Comprehensive Outpatient who present with a substance use disorder, which is causing multidimensional instability. Comprehensive Outpatient can be an entry point into treatment, a step down level of care, or a step up level of care. Comprehensive Outpatient would be considered for offenders who would likely benefit from structure and accountability. Offenders must be medically and mentally stable to attend treatment sessions in a group setting. From incarceration population: If an individual receives a recommendation of parole upon completion (PUC) of SAP, they shall be assessed by a Branch Manager or Program Administrator within the Division of Addiction Services to determine the appropriate level of care. If it is determined that the individual is appropriate for Comprehensive Outpatient and has a verified home placement, they shall be released to Comprehensive Outpatient treatment in the community. Individuals who are enrolled in SAP at the time of their release from a jail or institution can enter Comprehensive
