## INTRODUCTION

Supporting a successful transition to the community and maintaining stability within the offender population is central to the mission of the Kentucky Department of Corrections. The Department protects public safety by ensuring that offenders receive programming to support their successful return to the community. Programs are standardized across the Department, implemented with dedicated resources, and regularly reviewed for quality assurance.

This practical guide was prepared to highlight the Department's programs. Each program summary in this directory contains key information: a Program Description, Time Frame, Admission Criteria, Program Content, Applicable Policies, and Locations.

The Department maintains a catalogue of evidence-based, life skills, promising practice, and substance abuse programs to address a wide range of reentry, supervision, and incarceration needs. Program offerings vary based on available resources and the needs of the offender population. The Department of Corrections maintains a list of the programs that are currently available.

## General Information

### Definitions:

Evidence Based Programs are programs demonstrated by scientific research to reliably produce reductions in recidivism.

Promising Practice represents a program that may have some research or data showing positive outcomes but does not meet criteria as an Evidence Based program. Promising practices have a clear focus and includes processes of accountability and evaluation.

Life Skills Programs provide strategies to assist in removing barriers for successful reintegration and address skill areas including time management, money management, use of technology, communication, and social skills.

Substance Abuse Programs are evidence based drug treatment programs for individuals with a substance use disorder.

Religious Program means a program that does not have a secular purpose or a program, which has a curriculum that advances or inhibits specific religion(s) and does not qualify for program credit.

Program Description	<p>This <b>Evidence Based</b> program combines group presentations and individual assignments, along with facilitator guidance when necessary. The program was designed in a criminal justice setting for offenders involved in the criminal justice system. MRT® targets an offender's belief system and attempts to raise their level of moral reasoning in their decision-making process. The MRT® program has been researched for over thirty years and has proven reduction in recidivism levels at multiple points of progress within the program, as well as after overall program completion. MRT® is designed to achieve formal program completion after 12 in-group steps. The workbook for this program is entitled 'How to Escape Your Prison'® and includes the use of a separate facilitator guide.</p> <p>*MRT certification is required to facilitate this program.</p>
Time Frame	Length of time in program is dependent on individual offender progress, although offenders can generally expect to participate in 24-36 open-ended group sessions. Offenders will also be required to work individually on homework assignments as part of the program requirements.
Program Credit	This program receives <b>90</b> days program credit upon completion.



Program Name	<b>MRT<sup>®</sup> Mentor</b> <i>MRT<sup>®</sup> is the product of Correctional Counseling Inc. (CCI). MRT<sup>®</sup> and its related products are property of CCI. CCI is the sole source provider of MRT<sup>®</sup> products.</i>
Program Description	<p>The MRT<sup>®</sup> Mentoring program strives to ensure a higher success rate for those who have previously completed MRT<sup>®</sup>. A Mentor within the MRT<sup>®</sup> program will be held to a higher behavioral expectation than those participating in the MRT<sup>®</sup> group. Mentorship is beneficial for both the offender serving as the mentor, as well as for the offenders participating in the MRT<sup>®</sup> program. As a mentor, this offender will be expected to revisit steps 1-4 from the offender's original 'How to Escape your Prison'<sup>®</sup> workbook, along with completion of the 'Character Development'<sup>®</sup> Workbook. A maximum of 3 mentors per MRT group of 15 (ratio of 1:5) shall assist in monitoring and assisting the current involved group with step completion while working through their own specific program curriculum.</p> <p>*MRT certification is required to facilitate this program.</p>
Time Frame	Length of time in program is dependent on individual offender progress, although offenders can generally expect to participate in 24-36 open-ended group sessions. Offenders will also be required to work individually on homework assignments as part of the program requirements.

Program Description	<p><b>Recovery Kentucky Centers (RKC):</b>  The Recovery Kentucky model is a Peer-Driven model with the goal of changing how clients think, feel, and experience emotions in order to reduce substance use disorder and homelessness. The Recovery Kentucky model incorporates elements of Twelve Step Principles and Recovery Dynamics. The Recovery Kentucky model is broken into 5 Phases: Safe off the Streets (SoS), Motivational Track I (MTI), Motivational Track II (MTII), Phase I, and Phase II/Peer Mentor. During each Phase of the program clients are asked to participate in alcohol and drug education classes; participate in community meetings; hold themselves accountable for negative behaviors and breaking rules; attend self-help meetings; work a Twelve Step program; and complete written assignments. During some portions of the program clients are asked to “trudge” (walk) to classes off-site. “Trudging” represents a client going to equal lengths for their recovery as they did their addiction. **Accommodations can be made for clients unable to trudge**</p> <p><b>Reentry Service Centers (RSCs):</b>  Some of the RSCs utilize a RKC model which is referenced above. However, most of the RSCs utilize the Therapeutic Community Model to treat clients with substance use disorder. The TC model is a peer driven program incorporating Cognitive Behavioral Therapy in conjunction with evidence-based curriculum. Participants engage in education regarding their substance use disorder and have the opportunity to learn, practice, and apply pro-social behaviors. The community itself, through self-help and mutual support, is the principal means for promoting personal change.</p>
Time Frame	<p>Recovery Kentucky Centers (RKC): The program can range from 6 to 18 months, however, DOC only requires completion through Phase I; which should typically take around 7 months to complete. Program Name	<b>SAP - VOA HWB</b>
Program Description	The Volunteers of America Men's Halfway Back Program is offered to justice involved males who are on either probation or parole. The program was specifically designed to deliver the customary six-month curriculum at an accelerated pace using a modified schedule. This modification allows participants an opportunity to complete treatment in less time than traditional residential programs based on a client's individualized clinical progress as determined by the treatment team. A Treatment Team is held weekly in partnership with VOA and DOC Division of Addiction Services staff to review each client's clinical progress as it is correlated to successful program completion.
Time Frame	This is a short-term residential treatment program. Length of stay is based on level of care criteria in conjunction with treatment team review.
Program Credit	The VOA program is approved for the issuance of 45 days program good time credit when clients successfully complete the program in an average length of 45, 60, or 90 days. If it is determined by the treatment team that a client needs an additional 90 days of care (beyond the initial 90 days) resulting in the client achieving a full 180 days of treatment, then at the successful completion of those 180 days the client will be issued two (2) certificates that will each be valid for 45 days PGTC for a total of 90 days of PGTC.
