INTRODUCTION

Supporting a successful transition to the community and maintaining stability within the offender population is central to the mission of the Kentucky Department of Corrections. The Department protects public safety by ensuring that offenders receive programming to support their successful return to the community. Programs are standardized across the Department, implemented with dedicated resources, and regularly reviewed for quality assurance.

This practical guide was prepared to highlight the Department's programs. Each program summary in this directory contains key information: a Program Description, Time Frame, Admission Criteria, Program Content, Applicable Policies, and Locations.

The Department maintains a catalog of evidence-based, life skills, promising practice, and substance abuse programs to address a wide range of reentry, supervision, and incarceration needs. Program offerings vary based on available resources and the needs of the offender population. The Department of Corrections maintains a list of the programs that are currently available.

General Information

Definitions:

<u>Evidence Based</u> Programs are programs demonstrated by scientific research to reliably produce reductions in recidivism.

<u>Promising Practice</u> represents a program that may have some research or data showing positive outcomes but does not meet criteria as an Evidence Based program. Promising practices have a clear focus and includes processes of accountability and evaluation.

<u>Life Skills</u> Programs provide strategies to assist in removing barriers for successful reintegration and address skill areas including time management, money management, use of technology, communication, and social skills.

<u>Substance Abuse</u> Programs are evidence based drug treatment programs for individuals with a substance use disorder.

<u>Religious Program</u> means a program that does not have a secular purpose or a program, which has a curriculum that advances or inhibits specific religion(s) and does not qualify for program credit.

Program Name	MRT [©] – Moral Reconation Therapy MRT [©] is the product of Correctional Counseling Inc. (CCI). MRT [©] and its related products are property of CCI. CCI is the sole source provider of MRT [©] products.
Program Description	This Evidence Based program combines group presentations and individual assignments, along with facilitator guidance when necessary. The program was designed in a criminal justice setting for offenders involved in the criminal justice system. MRT [©] targets an offender's belief system and attempts to raise their level of moral reasoning in their decision-making process. The MRT [©] program has been researched for over thirty years and has proven reduction in recidivism levels at multiple points of progress within the program, as well as after overall program completion. MRT [©] is designed to achieve formal program completion after 12 in-group steps. The workbook for this program is entitled 'How to Escape Your Prison' [©] and includes the use of a separate facilitator guide. *MRT certification is required to facilitate this program.
Time Frame	Length of time in program is dependent on individual offender progress, although offenders can generally expect to participate in 24-36 open-ended group sessions. Offenders will also be required to work individually on homework assignments as part of the program requirements.
Program Credit	This program receives 90 days program credit upon completion.
Admission Criteria	All program recommendations are based on their specific criminogenic needs identified in the KyRAS assessment.

Program Name MRT[©] Mentor

MRT[©] is the product of Correctional Counseling Inc. (CCI). MRT[©] and its related products are property of CCI. CCI is the sole source provider of MRT[©] products.

Program Description	The MRT® Mentoring program strives to ensure a higher success rate for those who have previously completed MRT®. A Mentor within the MRT® program will be held to a higher behavioral expectation than those participating in the MRT® group. Mentorship is beneficial for both the offender serving as the mentor, as well as for the offenders participating in the MRT® program. As a mentor, participants will complete steps 13-16 from their original 'How to Escape your Prison'® workbook, along with completing of the 'Your Lifework'® Workbook. Participants must also complete a total of twelve (12) dedicated 'helping sessions' where the mentor's focus is exclusively assisting regular MRT group participants with no focus on their own step work. A maximum of 3 mentors per MRT group of 15 (ratio of 1:5) shall assist in monitoring and assisting the current involved group with step completion while working through their own specific program curriculum.
	*MRT and KY DOC MRT Mentor Certifications are required to facilitate this program.
Time Frame	Length of time in program is dependent on individual offender progress, although offenders can generally expect to participate in 24-36 open-ended group sessions. Offenders will also be required to work individually on homework assignments as part of the program requirements.
Program Credit	This program receives 90 days program credit upon completion.
Admission Criteria	Prerequisites: completion of MRT [©] in the last 30 months. No convictions of major disciplinary violations or Violation of Supervision Reports for the preceding 6 months. Must still possess original 'How to Escape your Prison' workbook from MRT program completion. Must successfully demonstrate retention of MRT principles via essay questions submitted to program facilitator for review. Completion entails 10 modules with a minimum of 10-12 group sessions utilizing the 'Thinking for Good' Workbook, and the completion of homework assignments prepared outside of group. *MRT certification is required to facilitate this program.
Time Frame	Depending on offender needs and progression, the offender should expect to participate in a minimum of 10 – 12 group sessions.
Program Credit	This program receives 60 days program credit upon completion.
Admission Criteria	All program recommendations are based on their specific criminogenic needs identified in the KYRAS assessment.

Program Description	This Cognitive-Behavioral program is designed to assist with relapse prevention by helping offenders to recognize risky situations, cravings, and triggers. This program requires completion of eight (8) modules over a minimum of 8-10 group sessions. Groups are openended and require the completion of the 'Staying Quit'® workbook, as well as preparation of homework assignments outside of group.
	*MRT certification is required to facilitate this program.
Time Frame	Depending on offender needs and progression, the offender should expect to participate in a minimum of 8-10 sessions.
Program Credit	This program receives 60 days program credit upon completion.
Admission Criteria	Prerequisite: Must have successfully completed a Substance Use Disorder Treatment program as approved by DOC on the current conviction and sentence. 	A recovery program for Trauma-Informed care, Breaking the Chains of Trauma is based on the MRT approach. It is designed to target trauma-related symptoms by incorporating the key issues outlined by SAMHSA's Trauma-Informed Treatment Protocol.
	The workbook for this program is entitled 'Breaking the Chains of Trauma'© and includes the use of a separate facilitator guide. The workbooks are designated by gender, as this program requires separate groups for women & men.
	*Training certification specific to the MRT Trauma (Breaking the Chains of Trauma) program is required to facilitate this program.
Time Frame	Length of time in program is dependent on individual offender progress, although offenders can generally expect to participate in 9 -12 open-ended group sessions. Offenders will also be required to work individually on homework assignments as part of the program requirements.

Program Name	Sex Offender Treatment Program - Community
Program Description	This Evidence Based program consists of individual and group counseling for offenders in the community. This program is geared to provide tools that sexual offenders can use for controlling their sexually assaultive behavior. Sexual Offenders are referred and are screened for acceptance into the program that typically takes months to complete. The program provides treatment for sex offenders to allow them to manage their deviant behavior and thoughts.
Time Frame	Depending on offender needs and progression, this treatment program may take from 24 months to 30 months to complete.
Program Credit	This program is eligible for 90 days program credit upon completion, however, application of sentence credits are subject to statute governing eligibility of sentence credit for sex offenders.
Admission Criteria	This treatment program is statutorily required based on the offender's crime and conviction date.

Program Name	Sex Offender Treatment Program - Private Providers
Program Description	This Evidence Based program consists of individual and group counseling by private providers to offenders in the community. This program is geared to provide tools that sexual offenders can use for controlling their sexually assaultive behavior. Sexual Offenders are referred and are screened for acceptance into the program. 501 KAR 6:220 defines the amount of time it takes to complete SOTP-P. The program provides treatment for sex offenders to allow them to manage their deviant behavior and thoughts.
Time Frame	Depending on offender risk level, previous treatment, and needs assessment needs and progression, this treatment program may take from 18 months to 24 months to complete.
Program Credit	This program is eligible for 90 days program credit upon completion, however, application of sentence credits are subject to statute governing eligibility of sentence credit for sex offenders.
Admission Criteria	This treatment program is statutorily required based on the offender's crime and conviction date.

Program Name	MEE Journaling Series MEE Journaling Series is the product of The Change Companies. MEE Journaling Series and its related products are property of The Change Companies.
Program Description	This Evidence Based journaling program combines group presentations and individual assignments, along with facilitator guidance when necessary. The MEE Journal Series (Motivational, Educational and Experiential Series) provides a structured, client centered, addiction series. MEE combines Cognitive Behavioral Therapy (CBT), Motivational Interviewing (MI), Trans theoretical Model of Change, experiential writing, and action-oriented steps, facilitated in groups of 10 – 12 within a group format, to motivate residents toward change.
Time Frame	Length of time in program is dependent on individual offender progress, although offenders can generally expect to participate in 48-72 hours of group sessions. Offenders will also be required to work individually on homework assignments as part of the program requirements.
Program Credit	This program receives 90 days program credit upon completion.
Admission Criteria	All program recommendations are based on their specific criminogenic needs identified in the KyRAS assessment.

Program Description	This Life Skills program is designed to provide information and resources to address the most common reentry needs and barriers. Some barriers addressed in this program are housing, employment, transportation, money management, parenting, etc. *PORTAL New Direction certification is required to facilitate this program.
Time Frame	Completion of this program is a minimum of 21 hours of group participation, and preparation and presentation of a Reentry/Maintenance plan in front of the group. PORTAL New Direction consists of 16-modules, facilitated no more than twice per week.
Program Credit	This program receives 60 days program credit upon completion.
Admission Criteria	All program recommendations are based on their specific criminogenic needs identified in the KYRAS assessment and should be 36 months prior to release from incarceration.

Addiction Services

Recovery Kentucky Center (RKC) and Reentry Service Center (RSC)

Recovery Kentucky Centers (RKCs): The Recovery Kentucky model is a Peer-Driven model with the goal of changing how clients think, feel, and experience emotions in order to reduce substance use disorder and homelessness. The Recovery Kentucky model incorporates elements of Twelve Step Principles and Recovery Dynamics. The Recovery Kentucky model is broken into 5 Phases: Safe off the Streets (SoS), Motivational Track I (MTI), Motivational Track II (MTII), Phase I, and Phase II/Peer Mentor. During each Phase of the program clients are asked to participate in alcohol and drug education classes; participate in community meetings; hold themselves accountable for negative behaviors and breaking rules; attend self-help meetings; work a Twelve Step program; and complete written assignments. During some portions of the program clients are asked to "trudge" (walk) to classes off-site. "Trudging" represents a client going to equal lengths for their recovery as they did their addiction. **Accommodations can be made for clients unable to trudge** Recovery Kentucky has a partnership with Kentucky Housing and if applicable client's will be required to follow HUD guidelines for housing and rent. Reentry Service Centers (RSCs): Some of the RSCs utilize a RKC model which is referenced above. However, most of the RSCs utilize the Therapeutic Community Model to treat clients with substance use disorder. The TC model is a peer driven program incorporating Cognitive Behavioral Therapy in conjunction with evidence-based curriculum. Participants engage in education regarding their substance use
disorder and have the opportunity to learn, practice, and apply pro-social behaviors. The community itself, through self-help and mutual support, is the principal means for promoting personal change. Recovery Kentucky Centers (RKCs): The program can range from 6 to 18 months, however, DOC only requires completion through Phase I; which should typically take around 7 months to complete. Clients may choose to stay longer to complete the Phase II or Peer Mentor portion of
Reentry Service Centers (RSCs): The program is typically six (6) months in length and is based on the client's individual progress and participation.
This program receives 90 days program credit upon completion.
Applicant has evidence of a substance use disorder that requires treatment. Applicant shall be deemed appropriate for this level of care by clinical staff within the Division of Addiction Services. Must be medically and psychologically stable – applicable to RKC placement only.

Applicable Policies	From incarcerated population: If an individual receives a recommendation of parole upon completion (PUC) of SAP or is determined eligible for HIP, they shall be assessed by a Branch Manager or Program Administrator within the Division of Addiction Services to determine the appropriate level of care. If it is determined that the individual is appropriate for community/RKC/RSC they shall be released to treatment in the community. Individuals who are enrolled in SAP at the time of their release can enter community RKC/RSC with recognition for the treatment already completed. From community population: The court or supervising probation/parole officer can refer a client to the community Social Service Clinicians (SSC) to determine the appropriate level of care. Applicant shall have a custody status of Level 1 (community) — applicable to RSC placement only. While enrolled in SAP a client may enroll in one (1) other evidence-based program. In addition anyone eligible to attend GED may do so and this will not count as the one additional program. Program Description	Recovery Kentucky Centers (RKCs): The clients who have completed all the requirements through Phase I with a Recovery Kentucky model program can apply and sign on for Phase II/Peer Mentorship. Phase II: Clients are eligible to seek outside employment and begin paying rent during this Phase. Clients continue to: work on maintaining sobriety; participate in community meetings; hold themselves accountable for negative behaviors and breaking rules; attending self-help meetings. Clients will also complete the 7 and 7 program which consists of mentoring and helping the SOS and MT clients in the program. Program Description	Comprehensive Outpatient substance use disorder treatment program can be an initial entry point into treatment or accessed as a continuum of care for offenders determined to be in need of substance use disorder services. Participants receive weekly group treatment in an outpatient setting through an agreement with the Regional Community Mental Health Centers (CMHC). Participants receive evidenced based substance use disorder curriculum and must abide by all treatment program standards including submitting to random drug screening. Due to an enhanced need in central Kentucky, the department contracts with the Hope Center to provide Substance Use Disorder treatment services akin to those offered in the CMHC's. Eligible candidates include MRS, probationers, shock probationers, parolees, HIP, and pre-trial diversions. ICOTS, Women's Medical Releases, SOCD and Misdemeanor offenders upon approval.
Time Frame	This program is broken into three phases, moving from most intensive to least intensive. CMHC's provide two-hour sessions, at the following schedule: PHASE 1: 3 sessions per week for 12 weeks (36 sessions/72 hours) PHASE 2: 2 sessions per week for 8 weeks (16 sessions/32 hours) PHASE 3: 1 session per week for 4 weeks (4 sessions) Thus, CMHC participants generally complete in six months (56 sessions/112 hours) Hope Center provides three-hour session, at the following schedule: PHASE 1: 3 sessions per week for 8 weeks (24 sessions/72 hours) PHASE 2: 2 sessions per week for 5 weeks (10 sessions/30 hours) PHASE 3: 1 session per week for 3 weeks (3 sessions/9 hours) Thus, Hope Center participants generally complete in four months (37 sessions/111 hours) Participants in the program may be restarted as determined clinically appropriate.
Program Cradit	This program receives 90 days program credit upon completion.
Admission Criteria	Offenders may be referred to Comprehensive Outpatient who present with a substance use disorder, which is causing multidimensional instability. Comprehensive Outpatient can be an entry point into treatment, a step down level of care, or a step up level of care. Comprehensive Outpatient would be considered for offenders who would likely benefit from structure and accountability. Offenders must be medically and mentally stable to attend treatment sessions in a group setting. From incarceration population: If an individual receives a recommendation of parole upon completion (PUC) of SAP or is determined eligible for HIP, they shall be assessed by the Division of Addiction Services to determine the appropriate level of care. If it is determined that the individual is appropriate for Comprehensive Outpatient and has a verified home placement, they shall be released to Comprehensive Outpatient treatment in the community. Individuals who are enrolled in SAP at the time of their release from a jail or institution can enter Comprehensive Outpatient with
