Program Name	Substance Abuse Program – Jail
Program Description	An Evidence Based Substance Use Disorder treatment opportunity for those individuals assessed with Substance Use Disorder and classified to be housed in a jail setting. Residents in these programs are housed separately from the jail general population, thereby forming their own community. This encourages responsibility and accountability through peer support and uninterrupted focus on substance use treatment. Therapeutic Community Model which includes but not limited to: ○ Practicing prosocial behaviors and attitudes; ○ Experiencing success or failure through trial and error learning process; ○ Being supported and guided by the community and staff; ○ Internalizing new behaviors and attitudes and becoming accustomed to living them on a daily basis; ○ Accountability is utilized by staff and offenders to bring awareness to Criminal & Addictive Thinking Patterns and behaviors; ○ Organization through a structure board that creates clear and understandable expectations; ○ Curriculum- Hazelden “New Direction”[®] Workbook Series (Intro to Treatment, Criminal & Addictive Thinking, Drug & Alcohol Drug Education, Socialization, Co-Occurring Disorders, Relapse Prevention, and Preparing For Release.)
Time Frame	Time frame for completion is an average of 6 months.
Program Credit	This program receives 90 days program credit upon completion.
Admission Criteria	Confirmed Substance Use Disorder Less than 24 months to parole eligibility or serve out In accordance with DOC policy, no disciplinary violations equal to Category 5 or higher within last 60 days (exception Cat 6-14 and 6-15) Category 3-11 or 4 disciplinary violation shall be reviewed by clinical staff While enrolled in SAP an inmate /offender may enroll in one (1) other evidence-based program. In addition anyone eligible to attend GED may do so and this will not count as the one additional program.

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Program Name	Substance Abuse Program Mentor – Jail
Program Description	An Evidence Based ongoing Substance Use Disorder treatment opportunity for those individuals assessed with Substance Use Disorder, have completed the SAP Program, and have been classified to be housed in a jail setting. Residents in these programs are housed separately from the general population, thereby forming their own leadership within a community. This encourages pro-social behavior, responsibility, and accountability through peer support and uninterrupted focus on substance use treatment. Therapeutic Community Model which includes but not limited to: ○ Model prosocial behaviors and attitudes; ○ Model success or failure through trial and error learning process; ○ Model support and guidance to peers and staff in community; ○ Model new behaviors, attitudes, and responsible living on a daily basis; ○ Model appropriate accountability to bring awareness to Criminal & Addictive Thinking Patterns and behaviors for self and peers; ○ Model leadership through structure board tasks assigned to create clear and understandable expectations; ○ “Now That You’re Sober” or “The Art of Leadership” workbook
Time Frame	Time frame for completion is an average of 6 months for SAP Mentor Program, but may continue as SAP Mentor as an assigned job.
Program Credit	This program receives 90 days program credit upon completion. Additional credit is not awarded if transition into the assigned job of SAP Mentor.
Admission Criteria	Must have completed SAP. Individuals interested in becoming a SAP Mentor must submit an application and participate in an interview. Applicants will be selected who demonstrate strong leadership skills, ability to communicate effectively with others, continually demonstrate honesty and integrity. An applicant with any disciplinary violation shall be reviewed by clinical staff on an individual basis. While enrolled in SAP Mentor an inmate /offender may enroll in one (1) other evidence-based program. In addition anyone eligible to attend GED may do so and this will not count as the one additional program.

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Program Name	Outpatient SAP – Jail
Program Description	The Kentucky Department of Corrections contracts with detention centers to provide evidence based Substance Use Disorder treatment programming for individuals classified to a jail setting. Individuals assigned to the Outpatient SAP Jail program are clinically appropriate for IOP or lower level of care (determined by Addiction Services clinical staff). Individuals assigned to the Outpatient SAP Jail program are required to obtain a job within the jail and attend classes outside of work hours. Residents in these programs are housed separately from the jail general population, however the individuals do have contact with general population through their job duties.
Time Frame	Time frame for completion is an average of 6 months.
Program Credit	This program receives 90 days program credit upon completion.
Admission Criteria	○ Division of Addiction Services Branch Manager or Program Administrator will review applications. ○ Applicant's file review indicates evidence of a substance use disorder that requires treatment. ○ In accordance with DOC policy, no disciplinary violations equal to Category 5 or higher disciplinary within last 60 days (exception Cat 6-14 and 6-15) ○ Clinical staff on an individual basis shall review applicants with a Category 3-11 or Category 4 disciplinary violation. ○ Shall be within 24 months of parole eligibility date or minimum expiration date. ○ Applicant shall be deemed appropriate for this level of care by clinical staff within the Division of Addiction Services. ○ Ultimate discretion for admission into the Substance Abuse Program shall remain with the Division of Addiction Services

Program Name	PSAP—Pretrial Substance Abuse Program
Program Description	Per KRS 196.285, individuals charged with Class C or D felony having no felony convictions within the past 10 years, may be eligible for treatment as an alternative to conviction. At initial incarceration, the Jail Pre-Trial Officer may alert the Division of Addiction Services Branch Manager or Program Administrator to conduct a clinical assessment to determine eligibility for SB4/PSAP. Upon an agreement between the judge, the commonwealth attorney, the offender in question, and his/her attorney, successful completion of a jail based treatment program may serve as an alternative to a felony conviction.
Time Frame	Time frame for completion is an average of 6 months.
Program Credit	Upon sentencing to DOC custody or supervision, this program receives 90 days program credit upon completion.
Admission Criteria	Confirmed Substance Use Disorder In custody in a county jail for pending charges No felony convictions (in any state) within the past 10 years Not currently on probation or parole Must not be charged with a Class A or B felony, or a Sexual Offense under KRS 17.500 Currently charged with an offense under KRS 218A or another offense and has a record of recent/relevant substance use

Program Name	SOAR Supporting Others in Active Recovery
Program Description	Supporting Others in Active Recovery (SOAR) supports participants in their goal to stay in a safe and recovery supportive environment after completing their program. SOAR is targeted towards relapse prevention, education, and reentry skills/resources. SOAR participants are given evidence-based curriculum from Hazelden called MORE (My Ongoing Recovery Experience.) While enrolled in SOAR an inmate/participant may enroll in one (1) other evidence-based program. In addition, anyone eligible to attend GED may do so and this will not count as the one additional program. SOAR inmate/participant may attend Portal New Directions and any variation of MRT at the assigned institution. SOAR participants who are not eligible to leave incarceration after completion of SOAR, are permitted and encouraged to remain in the SOAR dorm after completion. SOAR graduates are given the same opportunities for continuum of care as active participants. SOAR graduates who choose to remain on the dorm are required to demonstrate leadership skills by leading educational groups, AA/NA, tutoring and mentoring active participants in SAP and SOAR. SOAR is also designed to encourage family communication and engagement. SOAR clients are given the opportunity to participate in Family Engagement events. During these events, family and participants are given an opportunity to learn the importance of family involvement and recovery. SOAR participants will have the opportunity to participate in the work release program or in-house jobs. Job assignments are based on seniority in the program, custody level, facility need, and client behavior. Job assignments will be determined by SOAR staff.
Time Frame	Approximately six (6) Months, not to exceed (9) Months.
Program Credit	This program receives 90 days program credit upon completion. Participants may choose to continue to participate in the program after completion; however, no additional credit is awarded.
Admission Criteria	SOAR Entry requirements: • Substance Abuse Program graduate. • MRT graduate if not recommended to complete SAP • Applicants shall have 60 days clear conduct of cat 3-11 or 4 and above. Division of Addiction Services staff will determine if a client will be placed on refocus or recommended reentry into SAP if evidence of substance use has occurred. • Must meet housing custody level requirements of the dorm location facility.

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Program Name	SOAR Mentor
Program Description	SOAR Mentors must demonstrate good leadership skills, utilize their life experience and program experience to help others currently enrolled in treatment. Mentors are instrumental in the link between staff and offenders. Mentors assist and address offender issues and concerns with support from staff. SOAR Mentors expectations: ○ Model prosocial behaviors and attitudes; ○ Model success or failure through the learning process; ○ Model support and guidance to peers and staff in community; ○ Model new behaviors, attitudes, and responsible daily living. ○ Model appropriate accountability to bring awareness to Criminal & Addictive Thinking Patterns and behaviors for self and peers. ○ Model leadership through structure board tasks assigned to create clear and understandable expectations. ○ Hazelden- Now That You're Sober® workbook. While enrolled in SOAR Mentor an inmate /offender may enroll in one (1) other evidence-based program. In addition, anyone eligible to attend GED may do so and this will not count as the one additional program.
Time Frame	Time frame is an average of 6 months for SOAR Mentor completion but may stay on as a SOAR Mentor as an assigned job assignment.
Program Credit	This program receives 90 days program credit upon completion. Additional credit is not awarded if transition into the assigned job of SOAR Mentor.
Admission Criteria	Completion of SOAR prior to application. Individuals interested in becoming a SOAR Mentor must submit an application and participate in an interview. Applicants are approved by clinical staff. Applicants selected must demonstrate strong leadership skills, ability to communicate effectively with others, continually demonstrate honesty and integrity. An applicant with any disciplinary violation shall be reviewed by clinical staff on an individual basis.
