Program Description	<p>This Life Skills program is designed to provide information and resources to address the most common reentry needs and barriers. Some barriers addressed in this program are housing, employment, transportation, money management, parenting, etc.</p> <p>*PORTAL New Direction certification is required to facilitate this program.</p>
Time Frame	Completion of this program is a minimum of 21 hours of group participation, and preparation and presentation of a Reentry/Maintenance plan in front of the group. PORTAL New Direction consists of 16-modules, facilitated no more than twice per week.
Program Credit	This program receives 60 days program credit upon completion.
Admission Criteria	All program recommendations are based on their specific criminogenic needs identified in the KYRAS assessment.

Program Name	Substance Abuse Program – Jail
Program Description	<p>An Evidence Based Substance Use Disorder treatment opportunity for those individuals assessed with Substance Use Disorder and classified to be housed in a jail setting. Residents in these programs are housed separately from the jail general population, thereby forming their own community. This encourages responsibility and accountability through peer support and uninterrupted focus on substance use treatment.</p> <p>Therapeutic Community Model which includes but not limited to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Practicing prosocial behaviors and attitudes; ○ Experiencing success or failure through trial and error learning process; ○ Being supported and guided by the community and staff; ○ Internalizing new behaviors and attitudes and becoming accustomed to living them on a daily basis; ○ Accountability is utilized by staff and offenders to bring awareness to Criminal & Addictive Thinking Patterns and behaviors; ○ Organization through a structure board that creates clear and understandable expectations; ○ Curriculum- Hazelden “New Direction”[©] Workbook Series (Intro to Treatment, Criminal & Addictive Thinking, Drug & Alcohol Drug Education, Socialization, Co-Occurring Disorders, Relapse Prevention, and Preparing For Release.)
Time Frame	Time frame for completion is an average of 6 months.
Program Credit	This program receives 90 days program credit upon completion.
Admission Criteria	<p>Confirmed Substance Use Disorder</p> <p>Less than 24 months to parole eligibility or serve out</p> <p>In accordance with DOC policy, no disciplinary violations equal to Category 5 or higher within last 60 days (exception Cat 6-14 and 6-15)</p> <p>Category 3-11 or 4 disciplinary violation shall be reviewed by clinical staff</p> <p>While enrolled in SAP an inmate /offender may enroll in one (1) other evidence-based program. In addition anyone eligible to attend GED may do so and this will not count as the one additional program.</p>
