The Division of Corrections Training (DCT) is tasked with designing, developing, and delivering training programs that meet the needs of the adult institutions, jailers, and the Department of Corrections Central Office.

The DCT develops training curriculum for uniformed and non-uniformed staff across the department of corrections. DCT also conducts annual training for elected/appointed jailers and their staff within the 120 counties of Kentucky.

Having initially achieved ACA accreditation in 2011, maintaining accreditation is a source of pride for the DCT and the Department of Corrections. The DCT successfully completed the ACA re-accreditation process in February 2015, January 2018, January 2021, and January 2024.

2024 HIGHLIGHTS & ACCOMPLISHMENTS



In September, the Eastern Region Training Center hosted visiting committee members from the American Correctional Association. Committee members reviewed documentation, monitored procedures, and interviewed staff and students against 106 national standards.


The committee found the division in 100% compliance with all mandatory and non-mandatory expected practices. The division received reaccreditation in January 2024.

2024 has also seen a number personnel changes and promotions. In September, Kenny Talbott was appointed to Director of the Division of Corrections Training. Jason Joseph was welcomed back to the division as the Assistant Director. Derek Inman and Landon Driver were both promoted to Branch Manager positions of the Southern Region Training Center and the Western Region Training Center, respectively. Sarah St. Clair was promoted Instructor II in the Curriculum Branch, Adam Balentine was promoted to Instructor II and hired Mikel Paynter to Instructor I at Western Region Training Center, and Joey Sergent was promoted to the position of Instructor I in the Southern Region Training Center.



2024 YEAR IN REVIEW

In 2024, the Division of Corrections Training saw over 2,500 students across our 4 regional training centers. This includes 1,116 security staff, 839 program staff, and 722 contract and jail staff. Our staff taught 186 courses and presented



8,274 TRAINING HOURS


over 8,274 hours of training including institutional pre-service academies, firearms, firearm instructor, basic life support and CPR, supervisor workshops, train the trainer courses, taser, less lethal weapons, and deputy jailer in-service.

Our regional training centers completed 31 institutional pre-service academies in 2024. Across the commonwealth, 898 new students walked into our doors and 752 new officers walked out giving us a graduation rate of 83.74%.

ABOUT THE DIVISION

The Division of Corrections Training (DCT) is tasked with planning, coordinating, and conducting training for adult institutions, jailers, and the Department of Corrections Central Office.



The DCT develops training curriculum for correctional officers, uniformed supervisors, and non-security staff of the 14 adult Kentucky Correctional Institutions, Central Office, and Kentucky Correctional Industries. DCT also conducts annual training for elected/appointed jailers and their staff within the 120 counties of Kentucky.

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CURRICULUM DEVELOPMENT BRANCH



The Curriculum Development Branch is located at our Central Region Training Center (CRTC). CRTC is located between Kentucky State Reformatory (KSR) and Roederer Correctional Complex (RCC) in LaGrange, Kentucky.

In addition to the Director's office, this building also houses a firearms simulator, computer lab, and an employee wellness center.

The Curriculum Development Branch is responsible for management of the curriculum development process, the archiving of all departmental curriculums and the daily administration of the DOC's computer based training (CBT).

Currently, the Curriculum Development Branch is staffed with five full time employees; Justice Program Administrator Brandy Aston, Administrative Specialist Senior Susan Wittenauer, Instructor II Sarah St. Clair, Training Development Specialist II Cynthia Wathen, and Training Development Specialist II Kara Brown.

Central Region Training Center provides staff instruction to four adult regional correctional institutions: Kentucky State Reformatory (KRS), Roederer Correctional Complex (RCC), Luther Luckett Correctional Complex (LLCC), Kentucky Correctional Institutions for Women (KCIW); 10 Probation and Parole districts: 4, 7, 8, 12, 14, 15, 16, 17, 18, and 19, and the elected jailers and their staff within 24 counties.

Six full-time employees staff the CRTC; Branch Manager John Harrison, Administrative Specialist Senior Meredith Adams, Instructor II Dack Chisholm, Instructor I Ronnie Whitaker, and Instructor I Celeste Hurtt. There is currently one vacant Training Instructor position within the CRTC.



Southern Region Training Center (SRTC) is located on the grounds of Northpoint Training Center (NTC) in Danville, Kentucky. SRTC provides staff instruction to three adult correctional institutions: NTC, Bell County Forestry Camp (BCFC), and Blackburn Correctional Complex (BCC); nine probation and parole districts: 3, 5, 6, 8, 9, 10, 12, 14, and 20; and the elected jailers and their staff within 39 counties.

Four full-time employees currently staff the SRTC; Branch Manager Derek Inman, Administrative Specialist Senior Julie Thomas, Instructor I Logan Mills, and Instructor I Joey Sergent.
