# COMMITMENT TO EXCELLENCE



The Division of Corrections Training (DCT) is tasked with planning, coordinating and conducting training for adult institutions, jailers, and the Department of Corrections Central Office.

The DCT develops training curriculum for correctional officers, uniformed super-visors, and non-security staff of the 13 adult Kentucky Correctional Institutions, Central Office, Kentucky Correctional Industries, and annual training for the elected/appointed jailers and their staff within the 120 counties of Kentucky.

Having initially achieved ACA accreditation in 2011, maintaining accreditation is a source of pride for the DCT and the Department of Corrections.

The DCT successfully went through the ACA re-accreditation process in October, 2020 and will appear before the ACA panel virtually on January 26, 2021.

Statistical data regarding presentations and the number of staff trained at each training center is provided at the end of this report.



#### **CORRECTIONAL OFFICER**

A new correctional officer is required to complete Institutional Pre-Service Academy (IPSA) by attending New Employee Orientation (NEO) at the hiring institution. The Institutional Training Coordinator (ITC) oversees NEO instruction, which is equivalent to 40 hours of classroom training, delivered as Computer Based Training (CBT), within the hiring institution's computer lab. After completing NEO, the trainee will complete Phases 1 through 5 of an IPSA at one of the four regional training centers.

# TRAINING SYSTEM

### ADULT INSTITUTIONS, NON-SECURITY

All non-security staff receive 80 hours training through IPSA and upon returning to the hiring institution, will receive an additional 16 hours of In-Service training annually.

### EXTRA TRAINING CONDUCTED

The DCT conducted extra training throughout the year. This extra training included: Basic Supervisor Workshop, Train The Trainer, Taser Instructor, Oleoresin Capsicum (OC) end user courses, Less Lethal Instructor courses, Firearms Instructor courses, Corrections Defensive Tactics (CDT) Instructor courses, and CPR/First-Aid.



# TRAINING SYSTEM (cont.)


### **Elected County Jailers and Deputies**

Kentucky Revised Statutes (KRS) 196.070, Duties of the Commissioner of the Department of Corrections Training Programs, KRS 441.055, Regulation of Jails Adoptions and Revision of Standards, and KRS 441.115, Jail Staff Training Program and Jailer's Training Expense Allowance require the DOC to provide a minimum of 40 hours of training annually for the elected/appointed jailers and 16 hours of training annually for their staff at no cost to the jailers. The DCT develops a curriculum, annually, in cooperation with a curriculum committee appointed by the Kentucky Jailer's Association. The DCT provides the deputy jailer curriculum to county jails for delivery by members of their staff who have been trained by the DCT to act as adjunct instructors. DCT staff from the four regional training centers also conduct annual Deputy Jailer Training throughout the Commonwealth at locations requested by the Kentucky Jailers. The Deputy Jailer CBT curriculum is available for any jail staff that needs the training in addition to, or in lieu of, classroom training.

The Curriculum Branch staff are usually available at the Kentucky Jailer's Association Conferences, but due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the 2020 conferences were both cancelled.

### **CENTRAL OFFICE STAFF**

The DOC training policy, CPP 4.9, was developed to include Central Office staff in the training process. The CBT modules developed for Central Office staff have been reviewed and revised throughout the year.







The Curriculum Branch is staffed with four full time employees: Program Administrator Jessica Johnson, two Curriculum Development-Instr./Coord. I personnel, Brandy Aston and Nate Aseltine, and Administrative Specialist III Susan Wittenauer.

The Curriculum Branch is located in Bldg. #1 at the Central Region Training Center (CRTC) and is responsible for management of the curriculum development process for adult institutions, Central Office, KY Correctional Industries, county jails, CBT modules, the archiving of all departmental curriculum and the daily administration of the DOC's Learning Management System (LMS), MyPurpose. This LMS also serves as the DOC's Training Records System (TRS) for individuals working at the state level. CrimCast is the department's LMS for the jails and also serves as their TRS.

During 2021, the Curriculum Branch, with the assistance of training instructors at both the regional and institutional levels, reviewed, revised and added to the lesson plans of the CBT modules, Institutional Pre-Service and In-Service, Central Office, and Jailers' In-Service.



WRTC is staffed by four full time employees: Steve Farley Branch Manager, Instr./Coord. II Kevin Lewis, Instr./Coord. I Landon Driver, and Administrative Specialist III Wendy Johnson.

WRTC is located on the grounds of Western KY Correctional Complex (WKCC) in Fredonia, Kentucky.

WRTC provides instruction to three adult correctional institutions, including WKCC, Kentucky State Penitentiary (KSP), and Green River Correctional Complex (GRCC). WRTC also provides staff instruction to the elected/appointed jailers and their staff within 36 counties of the Commonwealth.



### Service Academy (IPSA), usually conducted at a Regional Training Center, was condensed to three weeks. Phases I and II, except for OC and CPR, were converted to computer—based modules monitored by the hiring institutions training coordinator (ITC) with regional training coordinators assisting with the hands-on training of OC and CPR/First-Aid. When necessary, regional training coordinators held smaller academies at the hiring institutional, rather than have students travel to one central location. All other extra courses, such as re-certification for firearms instructors, Basic Supervisor Workshop, and Train the Trainer were conducted in smaller groups and virtual training via ZOOM was also utilized when applicable. During all in-person training protocols were in place to ensure the safety of the students and trainers. Protocols in place include pre-entry temperature taking, classroom seating spaced 6 feet apart, masks and gloves required for both students and trainers with sanitizer available in all teaching areas; social distancing was maintained and monitored, even during lunch and breaks.

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic the DCT continued use of the adjusted academy schedule wherein the original five-week Institutional Pre-

## 2021 YEAR-END REVIEW


Instructor I Lee May with CRTC completed Master TASER Instructor certification in September 2021. This gives the DCT two Master Instructors for TASER.

As per ACA requirements, Corrections Policy and Procedures were reviewed.

The DCT received a score of 100% on the ACA re-accreditation audit conducted October 1-2, 2020 and met with the ACA Panel virtually, due to COVID-19 protocols, on January 26, 2021. To date, due to conducting both virtual and in-person hearings, the ACA Panel has not yet provided new certificates.

December 13-15, 2021 the ACA Annual Program Security Review was conducted at ERTC. Auditors were provided dual computer stations to review the DCT's electronic files. The auditor's final report "found that Training meets the standards in each and every category as required by the ACA Standards for Correctional Training Academies, 1st edition with 2016 supplement. Assuming that the current conditions continue, and there is no reason to believe that they won't, the Training should experience a successful ACA re-accreditation audit".

#### 1-CTA-3A-06 Correctional Training Academies


