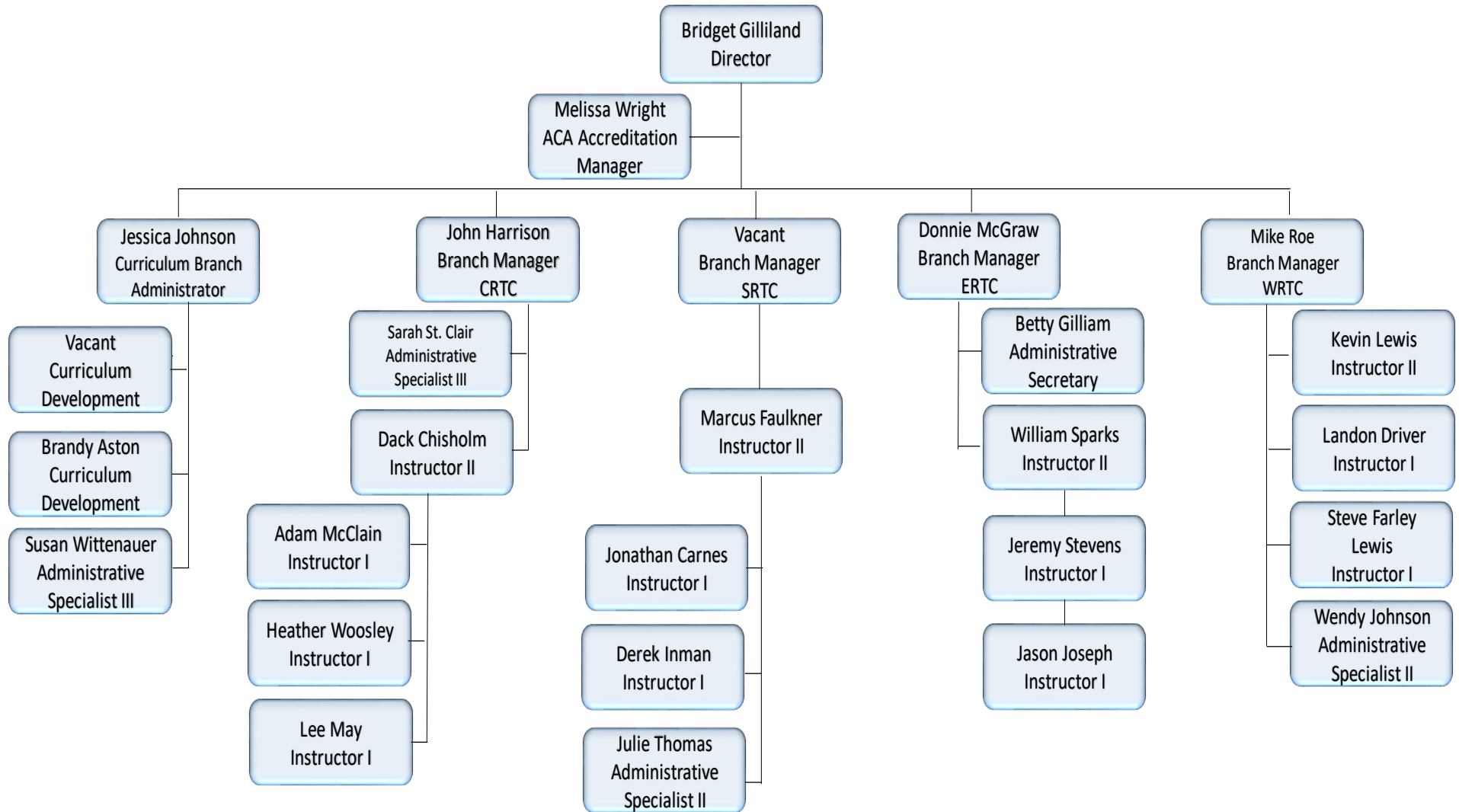

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Rules and Regulations for Students:

This Division has a written Code of Conduct which defines the accepted standards for all students. Any breach of this code may result in disciplinary action including dismissal from the training program. The Rules and Regulations will be made available to each student at the start of each program.

The course involves the review of sample requests and the required responses to them. It is appropriate for Offender Information staff who handle open records requests and any backup staff who handle the requests when primary staff is absent. It is also appropriate for anyone who makes decisions concerning the release of records or handles a response to a request including wardens, deputy wardens, unit administrators, PREA compliance staff, HR staff who handle production of personnel files, Business Office staff, CTO, Internal Affairs staff, Medical Records staff, Property Officers who maintain IM property records, District Supervisors, and Assistant District Supervisors. This is a 2 hour course.

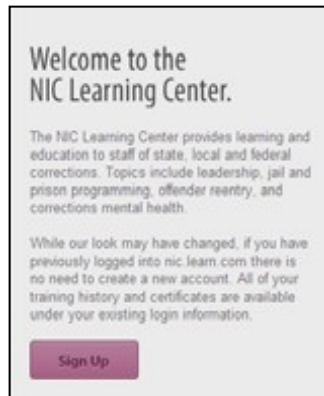
