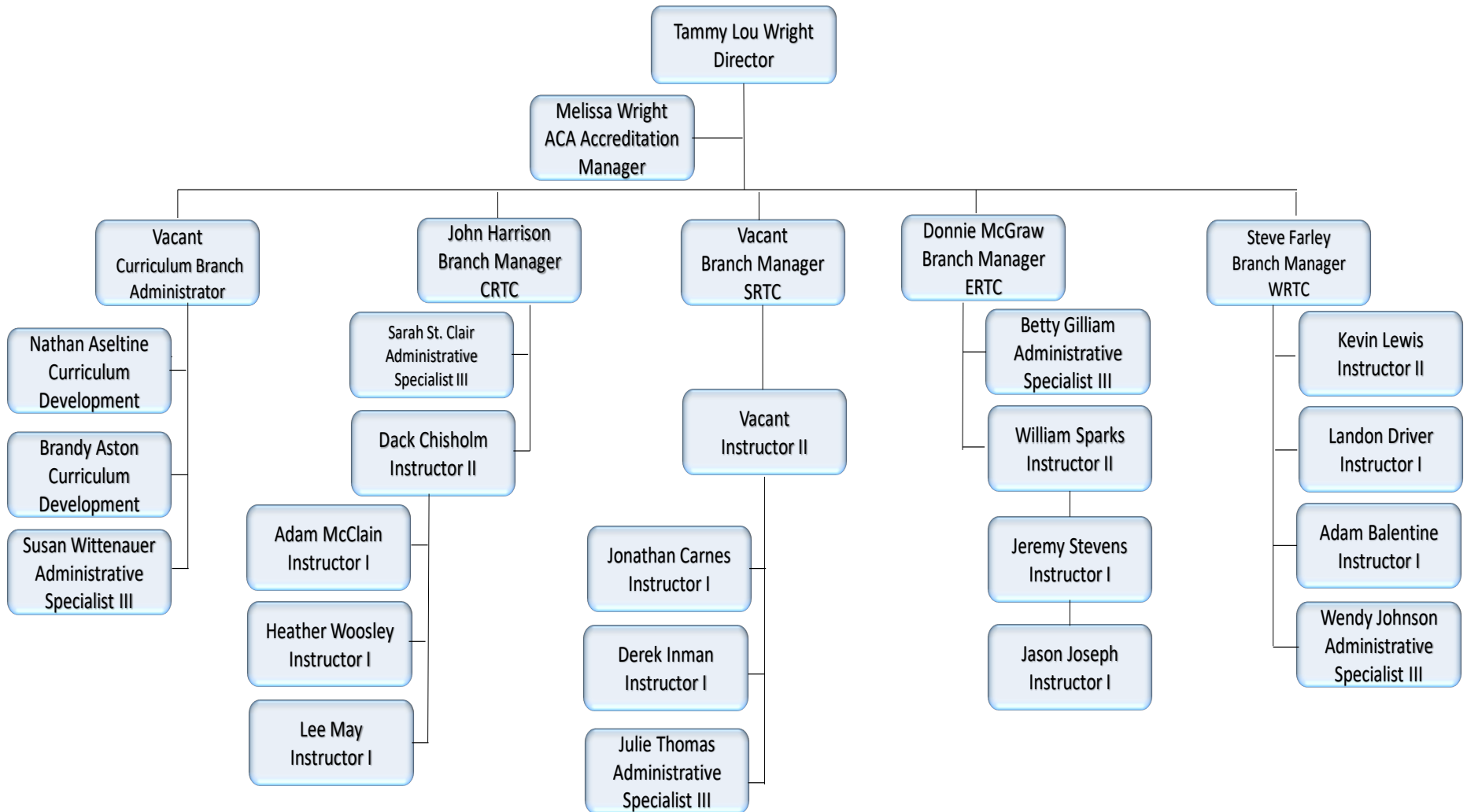

Emergency Response Training

Basic C.E.R.T. and CNT Training

The training will continue to include hands-on instruction in team tactics such as riot control formations, use of baton, use of shotgun, escape response, and simulated emergency situations. It is also appropriate for anyone who makes decisions concerning the release of records or handles a response to a request including wardens, deputy wardens, unit administrators, PREA compliance staff, HR staff who handle production of personnel files, Business Office staff, CTO, Internal Affairs staff, Medical Records staff, Property Officers who maintain IM property records, District Supervisors, and Assistant District Supervisors.
